2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes :

At the beginning of the academic year, the academic calendar is prepared. Moreover, the Heads of the departments hold periodic meetings with the other members to discuss the syllabus in detail. Field trips and visits are also organized and this helps the students to gain practical knowledge. Often the teachers arrange for power-point presentations to aid their lectures. Slide projectors, internet inputs, subject-related film shows are also incorporated in the teaching-learning process. In some subjects, seminars and guest lectures by subject experts on various core areas are also organized. INTERNET facility is made available to the students and teachers for enhancement of their knowledge. Viva is conducted in the subject of Foundation Course – I (F.Y.B.Com), Direct & Indirect Tax and Labour Welfare (T.Y.B.Com).

All the self-financed courses follow a range of teaching – learning methods, which are used by the faculty.

- Projects and Presentations: - The students participate in group as well as individual projects. The students make presentations on the same to the respective subject teachers who submit an internal assessment report.
- Home and Class Assignments: - The students are given questions on which they have to write the required answers and submit to the teachers.
- Group discussions: - Group discussions are held to bring out the pros and cons of the subject under discussion.
- Tests: - Class Tests are conducted periodically. This is especially undertaken in technical subjects to strengthen their conceptual understanding.
- Viva –voce: - Sometimes questions are asked from specific chapters to sharpen the students' conceptual knowledge and to build in them the confidence to face interviews.
- Interviews: - The students are made to take interviews with stalwarts in the industry and share their learning and experience. Mock-interviews are taken in Effective Communication subject-tutorials to improve the students' communication skills.

The first step towards participatory learning is to make the students interested in the subject. The subject-concept must be made easily understandable and relevant to the contemporary situation. This is ensured by emphasizing the applied aspects of the subject. Seminars, group discussions, projects, excursions and industrial visits help to generate the students' interest in the subject. The goal of the College is not just to help the students acquire good result and better their career, but also to make them better human beings and good future citizens. For this, the subjects are taught in a way that emphasizes their contemporary relevance.

There is a newly-renovated and spacious auditorium where seminars are organized for the benefit of the students. The large Library is well-equipped with computers and Internet connectivity. The Library annually adds to its stock the latest books as recommended by the teaching faculty. The Library also subscribes to over 51 periodicals. The students are encouraged to use all available knowledge resources to enrich their understanding of different subjects. Printed notes & study-material is given to the students in many subjects. Power Point presentations are given in various subjects like Direct & Indirect Taxation and M.P.P [Management & Production Planning] and Advertising.

The active use of Library facilities is encouraged among the teachers and the students. A variety of books, magazines, journals and Internet facility are made available in the Library. Talks and guest-lectures by distinguished personalities throughout the academic year are another unique learning resource for the teachers and the students. The teachers attend seminars, workshops and several faculty-development programmes. The teachers of the Commerce and Accountancy Departments attend workshops and seminars organized by professional bodies to keep their knowledge updated. The faculty members are encouraged to participate in Refresher and Orientation Programmes organized by the Academic Staff College and other University Departments.

The IQAC contributes in the following ways to improve the teaching learning process.

- Consistently emphasizing the importance of inviting guest speakers and organizing workshops and seminars to enrich our students.
- Organizing workshops to bring about qualitative improvements in the teaching learning process.
- Designing feedback questionnaires for teacher evaluation by students.

- Organizing sessions wherein teachers share information with their colleagues about seminars and workshops they have participated in and presented papers.
- Holding discussions on the college vision, mission, goals and objectives and presenting it to the management of our college for approval.
- Recommending concrete ways in which the teaching learning process could be made more beneficial to students in the IQAC and staff meetings. IQAC encourages the faculty to prepare & give updated study material to students.
- Requisitioning the college librarian to arrange for learning resources such as e-journals, e-books, reference books, periodicals etc.
- Giving suggestions for improving the infrastructure in the college which impacts the teaching learning process.
- Encouraging the faculty to pursue research.
- Encouraging the use of ICT, LCD and an interactive board.
- Encouraged to undergo Academic Audit.

Our college management encourages teachers in their professional development in various ways:

- Duty leave is given to teachers for attending seminars, conferences and workshops.
- The college encourages teachers to participate in Orientation courses, refresher courses, short term courses and training programmes by providing them information on the schedules of these programmes.
- Registration fees for participating in workshops, seminars and conferences are reimbursed.
- The newly recruited faculty are welcomed by the institution in the staff meeting and introduced to the entire faculty and the facilities of the college. In departmental meetings, orientations are given to the faculty who has newly joined.
- ICT infrastructure, departmental libraries, subscription to online learning resources enables teachers to keep abreast of latest developments in their subjects.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- Keeping in with the demands of the market forces, college has introduced self financing courses in the subject Banking & Insurance, Accounting and Finance and B.Sc IT. Students are encouraged to give Power Point presentation on socially relevant subjects by organizing competitions.
- The College ensures that the number of lecturing days prescribed by the UGC is strictly met, and the teachers complete their portions as per the teaching plans. It also encourages a number of teachers to pursue their doctoral research, minor research and participate in the Refresher and Orientation Courses and Seminars and Work-shops to improve their skills. The College conducts the examinations on schedule.

- The college has introduced Distance Learning in the courses like B.Com, M.Com, B.A. and M.A. of Mumbai University. Our college is the PCP Centre wherein lectures are held every year for the distant learners. Likewise college is also the centre for YCMOU courses. It is for the students of Kurar who desire to take higher education while earning.
- In B.Com. in the subjects of Foundation Course, Business Communication, Labour Welfare, Taxation, computer programming, computer systems and applications and Export Marketing there is a project assignment for 20 marks.
- M.Phil.(Commerce) have been started in 2016-2017 with 28 students out of which 25 have appeared for exam.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Classrooms, Computers Labs and Assembly Rooms are especially reserved for Power Point Presentation with the help of LCD (Liquid Crystal Display)
- Difficult subject matter is explained in a very simple language and even Marathi /Hindi/Gujarathi language is used to explain the subject-matter.
- The College encourages teacher – friendly atmosphere which helps the students in becoming better performers in the examination.
- Psychologically disturbed students are treated by Clinical Psychologist appointed by the college which helps them to improve their performance in exams.
- The Circulars concerning with examination, attendance record, list of defaulters are displayed on the notice-board. It helps in avoiding confusion during examination.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

In the present Examination system, there are two term-end examinations of 50 marks each at the level of F.Y.B.Com & S.Y.B.Com. Self-financing courses have a semester system where there are semester-end examinations of 100 marks (75 marks – Theory & 25 marks – Internal Assessment). Many subjects in the B.Com. Courses have provisions of Internal Assessment, which allows the examiner to monitor the students' progress. At T.Y.B.Com. Level, subjects like Direct & Indirect Taxation, Labour Welfare, Computer Systems & Applications and Export Marketing have Internal Assessment of 20 marks. Moreover, Terminal & Preliminary Examinations are conducted to assess students' progress. The Institute conducts the P.T.A. meetings, where the performance of the students is communicated to their parents.

Moreover, the class teachers take care of the academic performance of the students and counsel them whenever necessary.

We have formed Grievances Redressal Cell as per the University requirement. We follow all the instructions given by the University, such as,

- a. Allowing the students to apply for marks verification.
- b. Giving the photocopy of the answer book to the students who apply for it.

- c. Allowing the students to apply for revaluation.
- d. Taking the opinion of the Committee constituted for the purpose to ascertain whether the candidate who has applied for revaluation has any merit or not.
- e. Getting the answer book re-assessed (if recommended by the Committee). The result of evaluation is communicated to the candidate concerned.
- f. Conducting the University examinations, strictly according to the norms prescribed by the University
- g. Assigning separate examination seat numbers
- h. Strictly following the system of centralized assessment
- i. Declaring the result well within the stipulated time by the University.

The Principal and Heads of the Departments with the help of the administrative staff of the Institution, ensure effective implementation of these reforms.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The management and the Principal actively encourage the teachers to undertake major and minor projects, present papers at national and international conferences, and they provide necessary infrastructure and support for the same.

The college is having approved research centre in commerce and is in process of enrolling the students for Ph.D. in commerce. Two Research scholars are associated with the centre.

Our College follows the policies, resources and practices as per the guidelines given by the UGC, University and the Maharashtra State Government. The College has a practice of giving paid leave and reimbursing the entry fees of staff members participating in Seminars, Conferences and Workshops arranged at State and National level. The Institution always encourages Research Activities. Our Library is subscribing to 15 Research Journals pertaining to Finance, Marketing and Human Resource.

The college has instituted a Research Committee to nurture research aptitude of faculty members as well as students. The composition of the committee is as follows:

2. ICT:

- All the Department work, Pay Roll, Tax Calculation, Personnel details. Admission procedure, examination related work etc., are done through Central Computing Facility.
- Institution has installed Library Information System Software for maintaining book, journal etc.
- The institution has installed software namely “SMS” School Management System which is a part of Central Computing Facility.
- It contains the data related to the students’ personnel details with photograph and signature, attendance details, fees status, results’ data
- Up-gradation is done considering the requirements of administrative and academic activities.
- Self Maintenance of the computers is one in-house according to the annual computermaintenance plan chalked out by the computer department.

3.Physical infrastructure/ instrumentation:

Our Gymkhana provides facilities for Indoor games like Table-Tennis and Chess. The Gymkhana is equipped with the latest physical fitness gadgets. The students enroll in the Fitness Centre and exercise under the guidance of the Physical Education Director. The College also has a small play-ground inside the campus with facilities for Volley-Ball, Badminton, Box-Cricket, Kabaddi etc. Special coaching by experts is provided to the students in Volleyball and Cricket. Officials are invited to explain the technicalities in Bodybuilding and Power-lifting. The Annual Sports Meet is organized at SAI(Sports Authority of India , kandivali ..

6.3.6 Human resource Management

The mechanisms for performance assessment (teaching, research, service) of faculty and staff? (Self-appraisal method, comprehensive evaluation by students and peers).

The institution uses the evaluations to improve teaching/ research of the faculty and service of the faculty by other staff.

The Self-Appraisal Method:

The Institution has adopted Self-Appraisal Method to evaluate the performance of the faculty in teaching, research and extension programmes.

At the end of the academic year every teacher is given Self-Appraisal Form. Self-Appraisal by teaching staff is mandatory. The form requires the teacher to give his/her self-evaluation of the academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular work done during that year. It also requires the teacher to enumerate the papers presented at conferences, seminars, refresher courses and orientation programmes.

The Departmental report filled by each teacher is also evaluated and it analyses the duty performed with respect to lectures completed as per the Teaching Plan and the number of lectures taken. The Institution uses the evaluation to improve teaching/ research performance of the faculty.

The Principal appreciates good performance by any faculty member and persuades the other faculty members to enhance their own performance in the interest of the Institution and selfdevelopment.

Comprehensive Evaluation by students and peers:

Evaluation by the students and peers has also been adopted in our College which helps in teachers' evaluation and development. At the end of the term, the students are asked to assess the teachers' performance by filling up teacher evaluation forms.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

- Recruitment and Retaining of the Faculty
- Teaching Staff is recruited as and when the vacancy arises strictly as per the UGC, University and the State Government norms.
- College has the required number of qualified and competent teachers.
- Recruitment of Non-Teaching Staff
- Non-Teaching staff is recruited as per the circular from Maharashtra State Higher Education Resolution No. C/NGC/2299/4795 VS-4 dated 26th August, 1999.
- Recruitment of Faculty and Non-Teaching Staff for the Self Financing Courses is made by the Management and the Principal along with the subject experts from the College with proper interview of the Candidate.
- The eligibility criteria for employing part-time and ad hoc faculty are the same as that of full-time faculty. However, salary structure, workload and specialization differ depending on the courses and the requirements. Also vacancies of the Unaided Section are filled up by the Management and the Principal after interviewing suitable candidates.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / collaboration

- There is a linkage with Alumni Association, NGOs, Local Government and Police.
- Regular meetings are held with past students where discussions are held relating to developmental activities of the College and existing employment opportunities for the students. Members of the alumni also give talks to motivate the students. They also give useful suggestions to the students. This helps our students to become socially responsible citizens.
- The students and the staff carry out social welfare activities with the help of various NGOs. e.g. Dental and Dental Check-up camps, AIDS and Cancer awareness programmes, Blood Donation camps, Children's Sports Development, Self-Help Group Scheme, Yoga training, Disaster Management, Literacy Camps, etc.
- Guidance lectures by representatives of various agencies are held to enlighten the students about the career opportunities available in the field of commerce.
- With the active support of the Management the College regularly organizes a Career Mela where different educational institutes and professional agencies and NGOs participate enlightening the students about the courses and programmes offered by them.
- Industrial visits within the city and outside are regularly organized for the students to give them exposure to manufacturing processes and corporate work culture.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

The admission to the degree course is done in accordance with the university norms. As we have a Junior College attached to our Degree College, the first preference is given to the in-house students for the admission to First Year B.Com. In some cases, preference is given to those students who have some credentials in the field of sports and other extra-curricular activities at the State and National level. The vacancies, if any, are filled on the basis of academic merit.

We believe in maintaining and displaying the utmost transparency in the admission procedure. The list of the students admitted to various classes along with percentage of marks scored is displayed according to the schedule prepared by the University.

- For the welfare of the staff every year medical camps, eye checkup camps, camps for the health care are arranged. Highly skilled and professional medical practitioners are invited.

Students:

As per the University guidelines the College has introduced a Group Insurance Scheme in which @ Rs. 20/- per student per year is paid as installment. Thus all the students are covered under the group insurance scheme which provides insurance cover of Rs. 50000/- per student per year.

We have well-equipped canteen facility on the ground floor, adjacent to the main building. The food items are provided at a subsidized rate. All the teachers and the Principal often have one-to-one interaction with the students which helps to solve their problems. This is how the counseling support system is provided. Our College appoints a qualified clinical psychologist on a regular basis who helps the students in various ways as well as gives them mental support.

In order to inculcate reading habit amongst staff and the students, “Reader of the year trophy” has been instituted by the Library department. Dr. Sussmita Daxini bagged the Reader of the Year Award this year amongst Teaching Staff, amongst Non-teaching staff; under aided section Mr. Girish Paithankar bagged the trophy of the Reader of the Year. And under un-aided section, Ms. Parveen Shaikh has won the trophy for Reader of the year. Amongst students, Mr. Pravesh Yadav and Ms. Rukhsar Pathan bagged the Reader of the Year Award in Degree & PG Section, respectively.

As 2017-18 draws to a close, the institution looks back on a year of accelerated growth and remarkable achievements. The efforts put in by the college have been possible only because of the constant support and encouragement by the members of the Management and our Principal. We look forward to the new academic year with hope and confidence.

7.3 Give two Best Practices of the institution.

1. RESEARCH CENTRE:

The college has a well-defined policy to promote research. All the faculty members are actively involved in publication of research papers and participate in international national and state level conferences. Out of 10 aided teaching staff, 6 have completed their Ph.D., 1 is an M.Phil, and 3 are pursuing their Ph.D.

RESEARCH CENTRES IN COMMERCE (Ph.D & M.Phil) & ACCOUNTANCY (Ph.D)

The College is approved by the University of Mumbai for Ph.D Research Centres in Commerce and Accountancy, and M.Phil Research Centre in Commerce. The College has five registered Ph.D. Guides.

2. Annapurna Scheme :

The unique **Annapurna Scheme** provides nutritious and free breakfast to a substantial number of needy students each semester. This scheme aims to provide nutritious and filling breakfast through the college canteen to needy students each year, who attend college early in the morning, often without any provisions for tiffin, and also have to take up part-time employment after college hours to support their family. The Scheme was a brainchild of Late Shri Giteshbhai Majlani, whose generosity and concern for the student community has

been reciprocated by the other kind-hearted Management donors who have made this scheme possible. The scheme commenced in the year 2009-2010 with 30 students. It increased to 60 students in 2010-2011, and to 80 students in the next years. The SanskarSarjan Education Society aims to increase the number of beneficiaries of this scheme to reach out to the maximum number of needy students

CRITERION I: CURRICULAR ASPECTS

- Keeping in with the demands of the market forces, college has introduced self financing courses in the subject Banking & Insurance, Accounting and Finance , Management studies and B.Sc.IT Students are encouraged to give Power Point presentation on socially relevant subjects by organizing competitions.
- The staff regularly attends workshops on Syllabus Revision and Paper Pattern organized by the University. **Principal Dr. M S Kurhade is appointed as the Dean, Faculty of Humanities, University of Mumbai and Dr. Sussmita Daxini is a Member of Board of Studies in Commerce.**
- The College ensures that the number of lecturing days prescribed by the UGC is strictly met, and the teachers complete their portions as per the teaching plans. It also encourages a number of teachers to pursue their doctoral research, minor research and participate in the Refresher and Orientation Courses and Seminars and Work-shops to improve their skills. The College conducts the examinations on schedule.

CRITERION II: TEACHING – LEARNING AND EVALUATION

- The Accountancy Dept. undertakes practice tests at the T.Y.B.Com level in addition to the regular exams in order to improve the writing abilities of the students.
- The Commerce Dept. takes remedial coaching as per UGC norms.
- All the departments are distributing printed notes to the students for their benefit as most of them are from vernacular medium and economically disadvantaged sections.
- The Economics Dept. organizes Economics Day each year to attract students to the subject in an entertaining way.
- Department of IT organizes Industrial visits and job oriented programs.
- Computers Labs and Assembly Rooms are especially reserved for Power Point Presentation with the help of LCD (Liquid Crystal Display)
- Difficult subject matter is explained in a very simple language and even Marathi / Hindi language is used to explain the subject-matter.
- The College encourages teacher – friendly atmosphere which helps the students in becoming better performers in the examination.
- The Circulars concerning with examination, attendance record, list of defaulters are displayed on the notice-board. It helps in avoiding confusion during examination

CRITERION III: RESEARCH, CONSULTANCY AND EXTENSION

- The College has a Research Guidance Centre which regularly organizes free seminars for research scholars and enthusiasts. Experts are invited as resource persons to increase the understanding of different aspects of research.
- The College is approved for Research Study Centres in Commerce and Accountancy.
- The College has five registered Ph.D. Guides.
- Out of 10 aided teaching staff, 6 have completed their Ph.D. and 1 is pursuing her Ph.D.
- In the last four years, 4 teachers have completed Minor Research Projects approved by UGC. In the current year, 2 teachers have submitted the proposal for Minor Research Project to UGC/ University of Mumbai.
- The teaching faculty is regularly engaged in attending and presenting papers at national and international seminars and conferences. The management and the Principal actively encourage the teachers to undertake major and minor projects, present papers at national and international conferences, and they provide necessary infrastructure and support for the same.
- Many of the teaching faculty is regularly publishing research papers in journals with ISSN and ISBN numbers.
- Prof. Chandrakant Borle provides consultancy services regarding computer systems and maintenance to JDT High School, SHAKILAM Institute of Agro Business Management, Surat.
- Mr.Sunit Gamare Hardware & Software Tech from I.T Dept provides maintenance of computers at J.D.T High school and D.T.S.S College of commerce , he also maintain CCTV cameras in our College Campus
- Prof. Shubhada Apte, C.A., provides the services to staff & college in terms of Taxation & to college for the UGC Certification free of cost.

CRITERION IV: INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

- Our College is an aided college permanently affiliated to University of Mumbai. Around 5000 students of Degree and Junior College have been using the educational facilities for the last 32 Years. The college is located at Kurar Village which is beyond Eastern Express Highway at Malad. The College mainly caters to the needs of higher education of these areas. This is the only College on the Eastern side from Andheri to Kandivali. The College is an examination centre of the University of Mumbai. Besides, the College is providing space to the Central and State Government Offices, Banks, etc., to conduct their examinations. The College has undertaken the following innovations in Infrastructure in the last five years:
- The College has constructed an additional floor, due to which the number of classrooms has increased.
- Computer labs with a capacity of 120 students with LCD and projector have been set up.
- Photocopy Machine Installed.
- Both Library & Office work have been computerized.
- Gymkhana with fitness centre has been built.
- Two Lifts installed for staff and handicapped students.
- The college has a six-story building with air-conditioned assembly hall for conducting Seminars with a capacity of 250 people with projector facility

- Two computer labs with a provision of 60 terminal, library with internet facility for staff and students, separate common rooms for boys and girls ,separate rooms for NSS and Students' Council activities.
- The college proposes to have a separate building for self-financed courses in a near future.
- IT department is maintaining all computers in the campus.
- 06 projectors have been installed in classrooms.

CRITERION V: STUDENT SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

- Although our institution comes under Gujarati minority and 50% of the students can be admitted from the Gujarati community, however, the Institution supports the student community by admitting the students from SC, ST, NT, OBC and Open Category.
- The students are encouraged to participate in Intercollegiate and Inter- University extracurricular activities including sports and games.
- The College students have started The Rotaract Club of D.T.S.S College, which undertakes projects of social relevance. Students get the opportunity to interact with Rotaract members from all over the world at the International RAILA, which helps in personality development.
- The College has provided employment to a number of students in various capacities.
- The College has started Annapurna Scheme to provide nutritious snacks to under privileged students.
- The examination results are declared on the College website one week in advance of issuing of the mark sheets.
- Extension activities are carried out regularly by the Library, the NSS Unit., the NCC Unit., the Life Long Learning and Extension Unit and the Rotaract Club of D.T.S.S College.
- Every year meritorious students are given cash scholarships.
- The library committee selects many students for Book Bank and Freeship schemes.
- The reserved category students get Govt. of Maharashtra post-matric scholarships.
- ANGK scholarships are given to students from economically weaker sections.
- Scholarships are given to students from Minority groups from the Govt. of Maharashtra.
- The college provides a group insurance cover to the students each year.

CRITERION VI: GOVERNANCE AND LEADERSHIP

- Our College has a practice of encouraging Non-teaching Staff to organize various events such as Sports and various other Cultural events.
- Festival Advances are given to Non-Teaching Staff.
- In Addition, some of our Non-Teaching Staff also get benefit such as Advances against Medical during emergency.
- The examination results are declared on the College website one week in advance of issuing of the mark sheets.
- The Management and the Head of the Institution has full faith and trust in their employees and everybody works as a part of a team with a cordial interpersonal relation.
