- Identifying suitable mode of counseling.

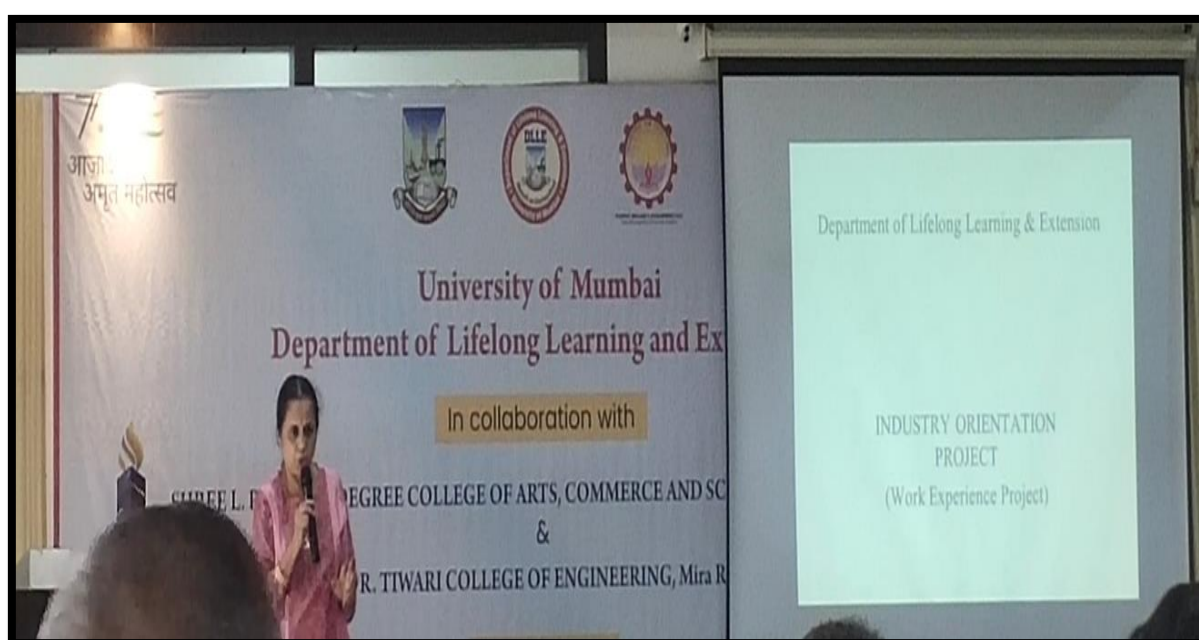

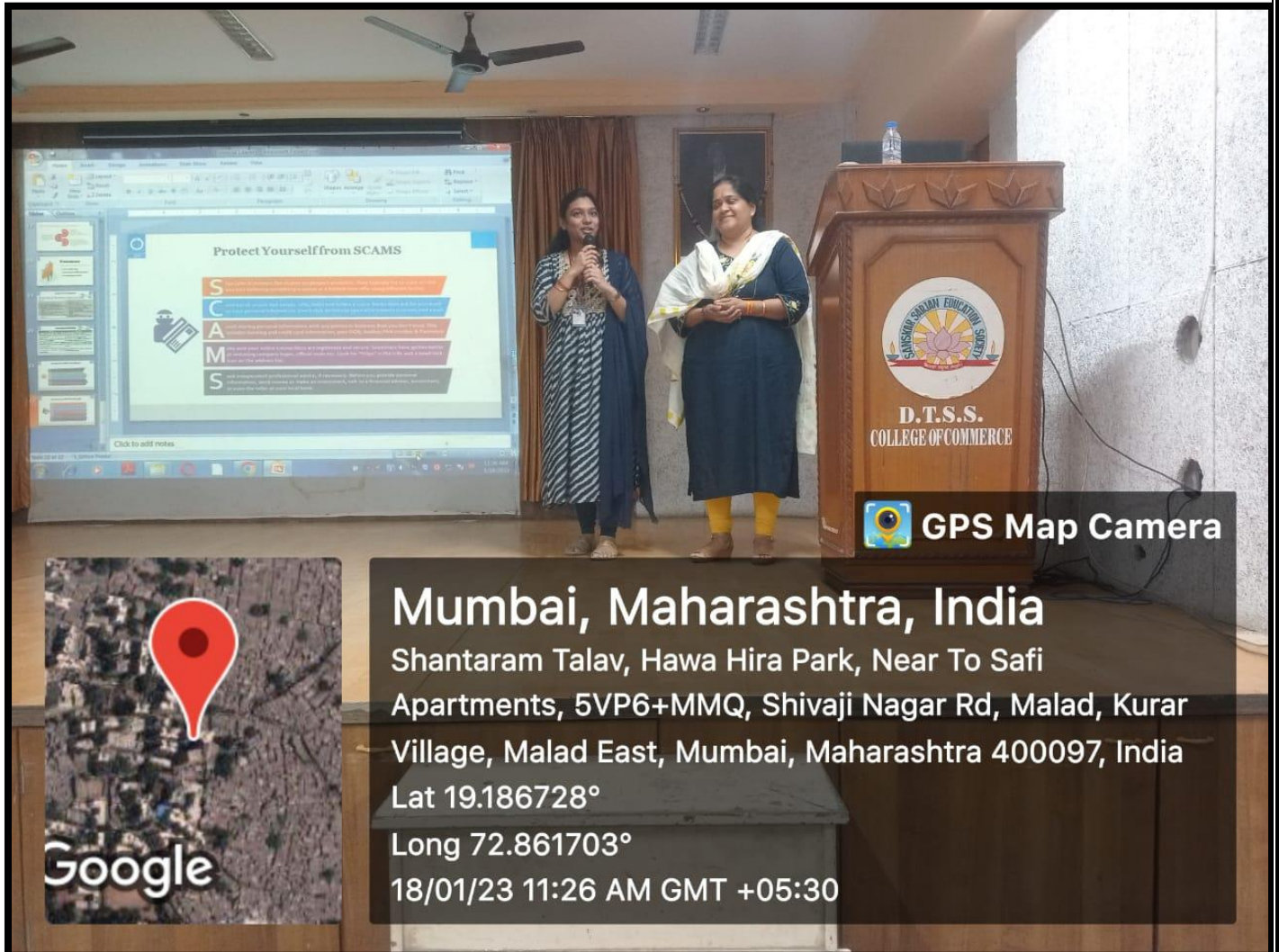
Cleanliness Drive at Kurar Village

PART I: AWARENESS DRIVE: The DLLE Students went for an awareness drive in the College and in the Community (Area near College in Malad East) highlighting the need of Avoiding Plastic Bags. The focus was mainly on shopkeepers and vegetable/fruit vendors who use the plastic bags in large number.

PART III: NEWSPAPER BAG MAKING: There were days decided wherein the students made newspaper bags. With great team efforts and genuine intentions, around 400 bags were prepared in the first batch and in the second batch even more bags were prepared.

PART IV: DISTRIBUTION OF PAPER BAGS: As the making of paper bags took place in batches, so did the distribution take place. Bags were distributed to the shopkeepers and vegetable/fruit vendors in Kurar Village.
